In English we say:

but in Spanish we say:

Me gustan **los** caramelos.

El means 'the' before a masculine word such as:

La means 'the' before a feminine word such as:

la música clásica	the classical music
la manzana	the apple
la coca	the cola

Los means 'the' before a masculine word in the plural such as:

los deportes	the sports
los Simpsons	The Simpsons
los caramelos	the sweets

Las means 'the' before a feminine word in the plural such as:

las pizzas	the pizzas
las manzanas	the apples
las películas de miedo	horror movies

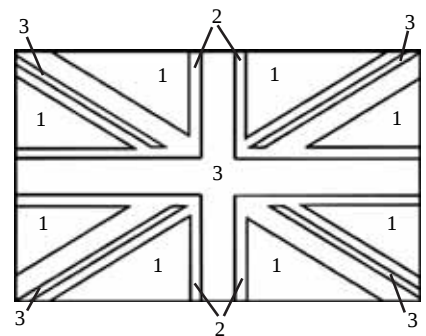
Include a map of your country showing where you live. Write '*¡Yo vivo aquí!*' (I live here) and draw an arrow pointing to where you live.



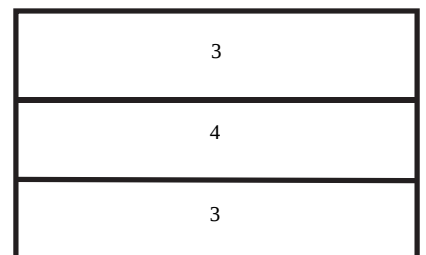
