

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



How to Teach Art to Children is designed to increase pupil awareness of the different kinds of art. It gives pupils a wide range of experiences and helps them to appreciate the art around them. Most importantly, it lets them know that there is no wrong way to do art.

In Part 1 activities introduce the seven basic elements of art – line, shape, colour, value (tones), texture and form. Each section begins with a definition of the element and provides a series of art experiences that allow young artists to experiment with the element.




Help pupils learn about famous artists' styles

Experiences are labelled as large-group, small-group, partner or individual activities. Each element is introduced with a large-group experience and then pupils' understanding is extended with small-group and independent activities. All the experiences are designed to encourage pupils to explore materials and techniques, rather than to simply complete projects.

There are 96 projects to undertake with step-by-step directions and full-colour examples.





Plan a Plaid

Pupils create a plaid pattern by filling in a grid

Step by Step

- 1. Pupils begin by choosing a colour for each of the four circles across the top of the grid. They colour in those circles.
- 2. Next, they colour the five boxes below the first circle the same colour that appears in that circle.
- 3. They move to the next vertical column of boxes and colour them to match the circle colour at the top of that column. They continue until all of the columns are coloured to match each of the circles above.
- 4. Now they choose a colour for each of the five circles down the left side of the grid.
- 5. They colour the first horizontal row of boxes to match the first circle on the left. They have already coloured those boxes once to match the top circles, so now they will be lightly placing another colour over the top. It begins to lend an interesting plaid effect.
- 6. They move to the next row and repeat the process until the whole page is finished.


